Based on the realization that surgical missions continue to increasingly address unfulfilled needs in low- and middle-income countries, *International Surgery* will give priority to providing surgical mission information to the world, as awareness of these unfulfilled needs is most important.

International Surgery is the Official Journal of the International College of Surgeons (ICS) and is published by the ICS. The International College of Surgeons is in official relations with the World Health Organization (WHO) as a Non-State Actor (NSA). As Editor-in-Chief of *International Surgery*, I commit to keeping publishing fees at reasonable levels for authors with limited means in low- and middle-income countries and to students. We commit to minimizing the time between manuscript receipt and publishing the research information.
